Calendar No. 02-365: 3824 Martin Luther King Drive (Ward 2)

First Greater New Zion Missionary Baptist Church, owner c/o Reverend Albert Maiden, appeals to construct a 5,770 sq. ft. one-story, 28' high masonry sanctuary on an acreage parcel located in a General Retail Business District on the west side of Martin Luther King Drive at 3824 Martin Luther King Drive; said construction being contrary to the Administrative Code, where members of the church would like to occupy the existing sanctuary while the new sanctuary and new parking facility are being constructed and the Code requires that the existing church be vacated before the new addition is occupied and that the new church not be used until the new parking lot is completed pursuant to Rule 113.1 of the Administrative Code.

Mt. Pleasant Church of God, owner c/o Brother Moore, appeals to construct a 30 car parking lot on an approximate 120' x 143' parcel located in a Two-Family District on the west side of East 126th Street at 3304, a.k.a. 3316 East 126th Street; said construction being contrary to the Residential District Requirements of Section 337.03, where a parking lot is not permitted in a Two-Family District but first permitted in a Local Retail Business District as stated in Section 343.01(b)(4) and contrary to the Off-Street Parking and Loading Requirements of Section 349.08, where parking spaces must be screened from the adjacent residential use by a solid fence or dense year-round landscaped strip and a non-dense strip is proposed and contrary to the Landscaping and Screening Requirements, where a 10' wide transition strip is required between the proposed parking lot and the adjacent residential properties as stated in Section 352.09 of the Codified Ordinances.

Memphis Fulton Associates Limited Partnership, owner c/o Paran Management and Larry Wolf, agents, appeal to change the use of an existing 35' x 99' one-story, tenant retail space into an adult video store and bookstore all situated on an acreage parcel within the Memphis Fulton Shopping Plaza, located in a Shopping Center District on the east side of Fulton Road at 4243 Fulton Road; said change of use being contrary to the Business District Requirements of Section 343.04, where an adult use is not permitted in a Shopping Center District but first permitted in a General Retail Business District if located 1000' away from residential districts, recreational centers and playgrounds and the proposed use abuts a residential district to the east and north and abuts playfields and the Estabrook Recreational Center and contrary to the Specific Use Regulations, where an adult entertainment use may never be an accessory use as that term is used in this Zoning Code and stated in Section 347.07(c)(2) of the Codified Ordinances.

Timothy McBride, owner, appeals to renovate the interior and exterior of an existing 18' x 57' single family house and convert the existing attic into a master bedroom all situated on a 25' x 100' parcel located in a Multi-Family District on the northeasterly side of West 7th Street at 2123 West 7th Street; said renovation and conversion being contrary to the Area Requirements, where the allowable gross floor area is 1,250 sq. ft. and 1,452.72 is proposed and the maximum gross floor area shall not exceed half of the lot area as stated in Section 355.03 of the Codified Ordinances.
