Be it resolved, by the Board of Control of the City of Cleveland that, pursuant to Ordinance No. 1841-02, passed by the Council of the City of Cleveland on September 23, 2002, as amended by Ordinance No. 360-03, passed by the Council of the City of Cleveland on March 24, 2003, Cost Control Associates, Inc. is hereby selected from a list of firms on the basis of submission of the Energy and Telecommunications Consulting proposal dated October 23, 2002, Pay Telephone Audit and Consulting Services proposal dated January 21, 2003 and Contingency Fee proposal dated January 17, 2003 determined after full and complete canvass by the Department of Finance, as the firm to be employed by contract to provide professional services necessary to audit the utilities and telecommunications services purchased by the City and pay telephones and services under licenses and permits issued by the City or contracts with the City.
