Thomas J. Branch, Sr., owner, appeals to install approximately 454 linear feet of 6' high chain link fencing around an approximate 153' x 142' triangular corner parcel on the south side of Hillsboro Road and the north side of Belvoir Boulevard in a Local Retail Business District at 1820 Belvoir Boulevard; said installation being contrary to the Yards and Courts Regulations where a 6' high fence is proposed in the front setback area and a 4'-6" height is allowed as stated in Section 357.13(b)(3) of the Codified Ordinances.
