FIRST READING EMERGENCY ORDINANCES REFERRED

Ord. No. 424-14.

By Council Members K. Johnson, Brancatelli and Kelley (by departmental request).

An emergency ordinance authorizing the Director of Capital Projects to issue a permit to Flats East Development, L.L.C. to encroach into the public rights-of-way of and beneath Old River Road, Front Avenue, West 11th Street, and Main Avenue by installing, using, and maintaining concrete building foundations and pilings.

Whereas, this ordinance constitutes an emergency measure providing for the usual daily operation of a municipal department; now, therefore

Be it ordained by the Council of the City of Cleveland:

Section 1. That the Director of Capital Projects is authorized to issue a permit, revocable at the will of Council, to Flats East Development, L.L.C., 2816 North Moreland Avenue, Cleveland, Ohio 44120 ("Permittee"), to encroach into the public rights-of-way of and beneath Old River Road, Front Avenue, West 11th Street, and Main Avenue by installing, using, and maintaining concrete building foundations and pilings, at the following locations:

Legal Description of Encroachment "A"

Situated in the City of Cleveland, County of Cuyahoga and State of Ohio, and known as being a part of Alfred Kelly's Subdivision of part of two acre lot numbers 191-193, as recorded in Volume M, Page 484 of Cuyahoga County Records and being further bounded and described as follows.

Beginning at a point at the intersection of the southerly line of proposed Front Avenue (72' wide) and the westerly line of proposed West 11th Street (72' wide), said point also being the northerly most point of lands now or formerly conveyed to Flats East Development LLC, and known as being Parcel A-2 as recorded in Volume 364, Page 87 of Cuyahoga County Map Records; Thence along said westerly line of West 11th, South 34°21'45" East, a distance of 111.19 feet to the TRUE PLACE OF BEGINNING of the parcel of land hereinafter described, thence clockwise along the following four (4) courses and distances.

Thence North 55°38'15" East, a distance of 2.50 feet to a point;

Whereas, Oatey SCS Company, or its designee (the "Enterprise") has proposed to construct a new headquarters located in Emerald Corporate Park in the Cleveland Area Enterprise Zone; and

Whereas, the Enterprise has certified to the City that it would be at a competitive disadvantage operating at this location if taxes on certain real property improvements were not abated; and

Whereas, this ordinance constitutes an emergency measure providing for the immediate preservation of the public peace, safety, property, and welfare and that its enactment is a necessary prerequisite to providing immediate assistance to create and preserve job opportunities and advance and promote commercial and economic development in the City of Cleveland, and the assistance is immediately necessary or jobs will be lost; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the Council of the City of Cleveland:

Section 1. That this Council approves the application of the Enterprise for enterprise zone incentives on the basis that the Enterprise is qualified by financial responsibility and business experience to create and preserve employment opportunities in the Cleveland Area Enterprise Zone and to improve the economic climate of the City of Cleveland.

Section 2. That the Director of Economic Development is authorized to enter into an Enterprise Zone Agreement with the Enterprise to provide for a ten-year, seventy percent (70%) tax abatement for certain real property improvements commencing the first year for which the real property would first be taxable were that property not exempted from taxation; the abatement shall be subject to annual review of the Tax Incentive Review Council.

Section 3. That the terms of the tax abatement shall be in accordance with the terms in the Summary contained in File No. 425-14-A. These terms shall not be amended, nor shall the tax abatement be assignable or transferable to any entity, without the prior legislative authorization by Cleveland City Council.

Section 4. That the Director of Economic Development is authorized to charge and accept fees in an amount not to exceed the maximum allowable under Chapter 5709 of the Revised Code and the funds are appropriated for the purposes listed in Chapter 5709 of the Revised Code. The fees shall be deposited to and expended from Fund No. 17 SF 305.

Section 5. That the contract and other appropriate documents needed to complete the transaction authorized by this legislation shall be prepared by the Director of Law.

Section 6. That any contract authorized by this legislation must require the recipient of financial assistance to work with, and/or cause their Tenants to work with, The Workforce Investment Board for Workforce Area No. 3 to identify and solicit qualified candidates for job opportunities related to the City's contracts. The identification process shall place special emphasis on the hard to employ, including people who are disabled and people who have been convicted of or who have pled guilty to a criminal offense which is unrelated to the duties of the job opportunity.

Section 7. That the Director of Economic Development is authorized to enter into an amendment to Contract No. 50034, as amended, with Emerald Research Park, Ltd. ("Emerald") to waive payment of \$30,000 per acre by Emerald to the City, upon the sale of 4.5 acres to the Enterprise within Emerald Park. All other terms and conditions of the agreement, as amended, shall remain the same.

Section 8. That this ordinance is declared to be an emergency measure and, provided it receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor; otherwise it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

That the costs of the contract or contracts shall be charged against the proper appropriation accounts and the Director of Finance shall certify the amount of any purchase under the contract, each of which purchases shall be made on order of the Commissioner of Purchases and Supplies by a delivery order issued against the contract or contracts and certified by the Director of Finance. Section 3. That under Section 108(b) of the Charter, the purchases authorized by this ordinance may be made through cooperative arrangements with other governmental agencies. The Director of Finance may sign all documents that are necessary to make the purchases, and may enter into one or more contracts with the vendors selected through that cooperative process.

Section 4. That this ordinance is declared to be an emergency measure and, provided it receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of all the mem-

bers elected to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor; otherwise it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

That the Director of Public Works is authorized to make one or more written requirement contracts under the Charter and the Codified Ordinances of Cleveland, Ohio, 1976, for the requirements for the term of one year or two years for the necessary items of the transfer and disposal of tires in the approximate amount as purchased during the preceding term, purchased by the Commissioner of Purchases and Supplies on a unit basis for the Division of Waste Collection and Disposal, Department of Public Works. Bids shall be taken in a manner that permits an award to be made for all items of services as a single contract, or by separate contract for each or any combination of the items as the Board of Control determines. Alternate bids for a period less than the specified term may be taken if desired by the Commissioner of Purchases and Supplies until provision is made for the requirements for the entire term. The Director of Public Works is authorized to enter into one or more contracts with a term of two years instead of one year when there is a financial advantage to the City. For purposes of this ordinance, a financial advantage shall be determined by the Director of Public Works by comparing the bids received for both terms.

Bids shall also be taken so as to permit an award to be made for provision of such services citywide or by separate contracts for the districts determined by the Director of Public Works.

Section 2. That notwithstanding any provision of the Codified Ordinances of Cleveland, Ohio, 1976, to the contrary, the Director of Public Works may require that each bid be accompanied by a single bond securing both the execution of a contract and the performance of the term of each contract. If a single bond securing both execution and performance is required by the Director, it shall be substantially in accordance with the form attached as Exhibit "A". Each bond, whether to secure the execution of a contract, its performance, or both, shall be in an amount determined by the Director of Public Works. Each bond submitted to secure the contract or contracts authorized by this ordinance shall be executed by a surety authorized to do business in the State of Ohio and shall be acceptable to the Director of Law.

Section 3. That the costs of the contract or contracts shall be charged against the proper appropriation accounts and the Director of Finance shall certify the amount of any purchase under the contract, each of which purchases shall be made on order of the Commissioner of Purchases and Supplies under a delivery order against the contract or contracts certified by the Director of Finance. Section 4. That under Section 108(b) of the Charter, the purchases authorized by this ordinance may be made through cooperative arrangements with other governmental agencies. The Director of Public Works may sign all documents that are necessary to make the purchases, and may enter into one or more contracts with the vendors selected through that cooperative process.

That this ordinance is declared to be an emergency measure and, provided it receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor; otherwise it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
