FIRST READING EMERGENCY ORDINANCES REFERRED

Ord. No. 218-15.
By Council Members Brancatelli
and Kelley (by departmental
request).

An emergency ordinance authoriz-
ing the Director of Economic Devel-
opment to employ one or more profes-
sional consultants to evaluate, assess,
and remediate brownfield properties
throughout the City of Cleveland.

Whereas, this ordinance constitutes an emergency measure providing for the usual daily operation of a municipal department; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the Council of the City of Cleveland:

Section 1. That the Director of Economic Development is authorized to employ by contract or contracts one or more consultants or one or more firms of consultants for the purpose of supplementing the regularly employed staff of the several departments of the City of Cleveland in order to provide professional services necessary to evaluate, assess, and remediate brownfield properties throughout the City of Cleveland, including but not limited to conducting Phase I and Phase II environmental site assessments, prepare remedial action plans, and other related services.

The selection of the consultants for the services shall be made by the Board of Control on the nomination of the Director of Economic Development from a list of qualified consultants available for employment as may be determined after a full and complete canvass by the Director of Economic Development for the purpose of compiling a list. The compensation to be paid for the services shall be fixed by the Board of Control. The contract or contracts authorized shall be prepared by the Director of Law, approved by the Director of Economic Development, and certified by the Director of Finance.

Section 2. That the cost of the contract or contracts authorized shall not exceed an aggregate amount of \$100,000 payable from Fund No. 17 SF 965, RQS 9501, 2015-6.

Section 3. That this ordinance is declared to be an emergency measure and, provided it receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor; otherwise it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

Referred to Directors of Economic Development, City Planning Commission, Finance, Law; Committees on Development Planning and Sustainability, Finance.

Ord. No. 219-15.

By Council Members Pruitt and Kelley (by departmental request).

An emergency ordinance authorizing the City to purchase electricity from an electric generation services provider for all City buildings serviced by the Cleveland Electric Illuminating Company and to participate with the Cleveland Municipal School District in a joint Request for Proposals to procure such services for a period up to three years, with two one-year options to renew, exercisable by the Director of Finance; and authorizing an agreement with Palmer Energy Company for energy consulting services.

Whereas, this ordinance constitutes an emergency measure providing for the usual daily operation of a municipal department; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the Council of the City of Cleveland:

Section 1. That the Director of Finance is authorized to make one or more written contracts under the Charter and the Codified Ordinances of Cleveland, Ohio, 1976, with an electric generation services provider for the purchase of electricity for all City

buildings serviced by the Cleveland Electric Illuminating Company at prices obtained through the joint procurement with the Cleveland Municipal School District for a period up to three years, with two one-year options to renew, exercisable by the Director of Finance.

The selection of the electric generation services provider shall be made by the Board of Control on the nomination of the Director of Finance. The compensation to be paid for the services shall be fixed by the Board of Control.

Section 2. That the Director of Finance is authorized to enter into an agreement with Palmer Energy for energy consulting services in an amount not to exceed \$15,000 and to sign all documents necessary to make the payment.

Section 3. That under Section 108(b) of the Charter, the purchases authorized by this ordinance may be made through cooperative arrangements with other governmental agencies. The Director of Finance may sign all documents that are necessary to make the purchases, and may enter into one or more contracts with the vendors selected through that cooperative process.

Section 4. That the cost of the contract or contracts authorized and the payment to Palmer Energy shall be paid from Fund No. 01 SF 001, and from the fund or funds appropriated for this purpose. Request No. RQN 1505, RL 2015-11.

Section 5. That this ordinance is declared to be an emergency measure and, provided it receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor; otherwise it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

Referred to Directors of Finance, Law; Committees on Utilities, Finance.

Ord. No. 220-15.

By Council Members Keane and Kelley (by departmental request).

An emergency ordinance determining the method of making the public improvement of relocating and upgrading the Computed Tomography Explosive Detection System, also known as the In-line Baggage System; and authorizing the Director of Port Control to enter into one or more public improvement contracts to construct the improvement.

Whereas, this ordinance constitutes an emergency measure providing for the usual daily operation of a municipal department; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the Council of the City of Cleveland:

Section 1. That, under Section 167 of the Charter of the City of Cleveland, this Council determines to make the public improvement of relocating and upgrading the Computed Tomography Explosive Detection System, also known as the In-line Baggage System, and making other infrastructure improvements to accommodate the relocation (the "Improvement"), for the Division of Cleveland Hopkins International Airport, Department of Port Control, by one or more contracts duly let to the lowest responsible bidder or bidders after competitive bidding on a unit basis for the Improvement.

Section 2. That the Director of Port Control is authorized to enter into one or more contracts for the making of the Improvement with the lowest responsible bidder or bidders after competitive bidding on a unit basis for the Improvement, provided, however, that each separate trade and each distinct component part of the Improvement may be treated as a separate improvement, and each, or any combination, of the trades or components may be the subject of a separate contract on a unit basis.

Section 3. That the Director of Port Control is authorized to apply and pay for permits, licenses, or other authorizations required by any regulatory agency or public authority to permit performance of the work authorized by this ordinance.

Section 4. That the cost of the contracts and other expenditures authorized shall be paid from Fund Nos. 60 SF 001, 60 SF 104, 60 SF 106, 60 SF 112, 60 SF 114, 60 SF 115, 60 SF 116, 60 SF 117, 60 SF 119, 60 SF 121, 60 SF 122, 60 SF 126, 60 SF 128, 60 SF 130, 60 SF 141, 60 SF 160, and from the fund or funds to which are credited any grant proceeds accepted for this purpose and federal passenger facility charges, if authorized for this purpose, Request No. RQS 3001, RL 2015-30.

Section 5. That this ordinance is declared to be an emergency measure and, provided it receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor; otherwise it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

for the Improvement, provided, however, that each separate trade and each distinct component part of the Improvement may be treated as a separate improvement, and each, or any combination, of the trades or components may be the subject of a separate contract on a unit basis.

Section 3. That the Director of Port Control is authorized to apply and pay for permits, licenses, or other authorizations required by any regulatory agency or public authority to permit performance of the work authorized by this ordinance.

Section 4. That the Director of Port Control is authorized to employ by contract or contracts one or more consultants or one or more firms of consultants for the purpose of supplementing the regularly employed staff of the several departments of the City of Cleveland in order to provide professional services necessary to design the Improvement.

The selection of the consultants for the services shall be made by the Board of Control on the nomination of the Director of Port Control from a list of qualified consultants available for employment as may be determined after a full and complete canvass by the Director of Port Control for the purpose of compiling a list. The compensation to be paid for the services shall be fixed by the Board of Control. The contract or contracts authorized shall be prepared by the Director of Law, approved by the Director of Port Control, and certified by the Director of Finance.

Section 5. That the cost of the contracts and other expenditures authorized shall be paid from Fund Nos. 60 SF 001, 60 SF 104, 60 SF 106, 60 SF 112, 60 SF 114, 60 SF 115, 60 SF 116, 60 SF 117, 60 SF 119, 60 SF 121, 60 SF 122, 60 SF 126, 60 SF 128, 60 SF 130, 60 SF 141, 60 SF 160, and from the fund or funds to which are credited any grant proceeds accepted for this purpose of federal passenger facility charges, if authorized for this purpose, Request No. RQS 3001, RL 2015-31.

Whereas, in a recent hiring announcement for lifeguards for the Metroparks, Euclid Beach and Villa Angela Beach were, once again, excluded; and

Whereas, the community is greatly concerned about the lack of lifeguards at these two vital parks with the only two swimming beaches on Cleveland's east side; and

Whereas, last summer park goers and residents expressed concern about the lack of lifeguards and the number of drowning victims at these beaches; and

Whereas, concern is growing this year about the disparity of east side beaches being neglected again, while at the same time Edgewater and Huntington beaches will have lifeguards; and

Whereas, State Representative Bill Patmon along with Cuyahoga County Councilmember Anthony Hairston share this Council's concern over the threat that not stationing lifeguards poses to public safety at these beaches; and

Whereas, the lack of lifeguards has been attributed to poor water quality and the lacking number of

days the beaches were able to be used for swimming as a result; but regardless of the water quality and posted signs, people, especially kids, go in the water, so lifeguards are crucial to ensure public safety; and

Whereas, in 2015, there must be parity along the lakefront, and Euclid Beach and Villa Angela Beach must be treated equally along with Edgewater and any of the other lakefront parks, especially when stationing lifeguards; and

Whereas, this resolution constitutes an emergency measure for the immediate preservation of public peace, property, health or safety, now, therefore,

Be it resolved by the Council of the City of Cleveland:

Section 1. That this Council urges the Metroparks to station lifeguards at Euclid Beach and Villa Angela Beach.

Section 2. That the appropriations herein made are based upon the detail of expenditures set forth in the Mayor's Estimate, but are appropriated to the several departments, offices, and purposes in the aggregate for I. - Personnel and Related Expenses; and II. - Other Expenses and are not severally and individually appropriated in said detail. Any unencumbered balance in an appropriation fund at the close of the year 2014 is hereby appropriated to such fund for the payment of unpaid obligations lawfully incurred in 2015 or prior years. The Mayor's Estimate, File No. 110-15-A, as modified by the schedule published pursuant to Section 39 of the Charter shall within the sums appropriated in Section 1 hereof, constitute the expenditure budget for the year 2015 and shall be subject to the control of the Mayor, provided, however, that no transfer from I. - Personnel and Related Expenses, or II. - Other Expenses within any department or office, or from one department or office to another shall be made except as provided in Section 41 of the Charter.

Section 3. That the Commissioner of Accounts is authorized to draw warrants upon the City Treasury for the amount appropriated in this ordinance, whenever claims are presented properly approved by the head of the department or by the chief of a commission for which indebtedness was incurred.

Section 4. That this ordinance is declared to be an emergency measure and, provided it receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to Council, it shall take effect and be in force upon its passage and approval by the Mayor; otherwise it shall take effect and be in force at the earliest period allowed by law.
