Whereas, under the authority of Ordinance No. 744-12, passed by the Council of the City of Cleveland on September 24, 2012, and Board of Control Resolution No. 547-12, adopted October 24, 2012, the City through its Director of Port Control, entered into Contract No. PS2013*036 with Kokosing Construction Company, Inc., ("Consultant"), to provide design/build services for the Transient Marina and associated improvements at the North Coast Harbor, for the Department of Port Control; and

Whereas, the City has determined the need to add a pedestrian bridge operator's room to the Transient Marina's amenities building as part of the City's Voinovich Park Pedestrian Bridge project; and

Whereas, the Consultant has proposed, by the add-alternate element of its original Transient Marina Proposal dated September 17, 2012, to perform the additional work necessary; now, therefore,

Be it resolved by the Board of Control of the City of Cleveland that the Director of Port Control is authorized to enter into a first modification to City Contract No. PS2013*036 between the City of Cleveland and Kokosing Construction Company, Inc., for additional services necessary to add a pedestrian bridge operator's room to the Transient Marina Project. The pedestrian bridge operator's room will be a separate structure from the Transient Marina's amenities building. The compensation to be paid for all services performed under the first modification authorized above shall be \$250,000.00, thereby increasing the total compensation under the contract, as modified, from \$2,361,650.00 to an amount not to exceed \$2,611,650.00. The Director of Law shall prepare the first modification authorized above and shall include such addi-

tional provisions as the Director deems necessary to benefit and protect the public interest.
