FIRST READING EMERGENCY ORDINANCES REFERRED

Ord. No. 1304-17.

By Council Members K. Johnson and Brancatelli (by departmental request).

An emergency ordinance authorizing the Director of Capital Projects to issue a permit to the Playhouse Square Foundation to encroach into the public rights-of-way of Euclid Avenue, East 17th Street, and Brownell Court by installing, using, and maintaining an entry canopy, apartment balconies, a building overhang at the northeast corner, and an earth retention system with tiebacks.

Whereas, this ordinance constitutes an emergency measure providing for the usual daily operation of a municipal department; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the Council of the City of Cleveland:

Section 1. That the Director of Capital Projects is authorized to issue a permit, revocable at the will of Council, to the Playhouse Square Foundation, 1501 Euclid Avenue, Cleveland Ohio, 44115 ("Permittee"), to encroach into the public rights-of-way of Euclid Avenue, East 17th Street, and Brownell Court, by installing, using, and maintaining an entry canopy, apartment balconies, a building overhang at the northeast corner, and an earth retention system with tiebacks, at the following locations:

Encroachment #1 - Euclid Avenue Earth Retention

Situated in the City of Cleveland, County of Cuyahoga, State of Ohio, and known as being part of Sublots 17 and 18 in Block 4 of Seymour & Baldwin's Allotment of part of Original 10 Acre Lots 51 and 52 as shown by the plat recorded in Volume "U", Page 616 of Cuyahoga County Deed Records, and bounded and described as follows:

Commencing at a stone monument found at an angle point in the centerline of Euclid Avenue (99 feet wide), said point being distant South 79°11'56" West measured along said centerline 23.06 feet from its intersection with the centerline of East 14th Street, (86 feet wide);

(L1) Thence North 81°02'24" East along the centerline of Euclid Avenue a distance of 13.23 feet to a point;

(L2) Thence South 34°43'03" East a distance of 54.96 feet to a drill hole set in the Southerly line of Euclid Avenue at its intersection with the Northeasterly line of East 14th Street;

(L3) Thence North 81°02'24" East along the Southerly line of Euclid Avenue a distance of 199.08 feet to its intersection with the Easterly line of a parcel of land conveyed to The T. W. Grogan Company by deed recorded in Volume 14489, Page 175 of Cuyahoga County Records, also known as the principal place of beginning;

Course 1. (L4) Thence North 08°53'30" West a distance of 6.50 feet to a point;

Course 2. (L5) Thence North 81°02'24" East a distance of 237.67 feet to a point;

Course 3. (L6) Thence South 08°56'48" East a distance of 156.95 feet to a point on the westerly right of way of East 17th Street;

Course 4. (C1) Thence along the westerly line of said East 17th Street along a curve to the right having a Chord Bearing of North 14°26'14" West, Chord Length of 67.93 feet and a Radius of 355.00 feet to a point;

Course 5. (L7) Thence North 08°56'48" West continuing along the westerly line of East 17th Street a distance of 67.82 feet to a point;

Course 6. (C2) Thence continuing along the westerly line of East 17th Street along a curve to the left having a Chord Bearing of North 53°57'09" West, Chord Length of 21.22 feet, and a Radius of 15.00 feet to a point on the southerly line of Euclid Avenue;

Course 7. (L8) Thence South 81°02'24" West a distance of 216.17 feet to the Point of Beginning and containing 0.0556 acres be the same

more or less but subject to all legal highways and easements of record.

Course 1. (L5) Thence North 81°02'37" East along the northerly line of Brownell Court a distance of 237.86 feet to a point;

Course 2. (L6) Thence South 08°53'30" East a distance of 6.50 feet to a point;

Course 3. (L7) Thence South 81°02'37" West a distance of 237.86 feet to a point;

Course 4. (L8) Thence North 08°53'30" West a distance of 6.50 feet to the Point of Beginning and containing 0.0354 acres be the same more or less but subject to all legal highways and easements of record.

Elevation: At to below existing grade.

Basis of bearing: Bearings are based on the centerline of Euclid Avenue as shown in the Euclid Corridor Centerline Survey produced by the City of Cleveland Division of Engineering & Construction.

Encroachment #3 - Euclid Garage Canopy

The selection of the consultants for the services shall be made by the Board of Control on the nomination of the Director of Port Control from a list of qualified consultants available for employment as may be determined after a full and complete canvass by the Director of Port Control for the purpose of compiling a list. The compensation to be paid for the services shall be fixed by the Board of Control. The contract or contracts authorized shall be prepared by the Director of Law, approved by the Director of Port Control, and certified by the Director of Finance.

Section 5. That the Director of Port Control is authorized to make one or more written standard purchase contracts and written requirement contracts under the Charter and the Codified Ordinances of Cleveland, Ohio, 1976, for the necessary items of materials, equipment, supplies, and services necessary to implement the Improvement, including labor and materials if necessary, to be purchased by the Commissioner of Purchases and Supplies on a unit basis for the Department of Port Control. Bids shall be taken in a manner that permits an award to be made for all items as a single contract, or by separate contract for each or any combination of the items as the Board of Control determines, for a period of one year with three one-year options to renew. The first of the one-year options to renew may be exercised by the Director of Port Control, without the necessity of obtaining additional authority of this Council. The second of the one-year options to renew may not be exercised without additional legislative authority. If such additional legislative authority is granted and the second of the one-year options to renew is exercised, then the third of the one-year options to renew may be exercisable at the option of the Director of Port Control, without the necessity of obtaining additional authority of this Council.

Section 6. That the costs of the contract or contracts shall be charged against the proper appropriation accounts and the Director of Finance shall certify the amount of any purchase under the contract, each of which purchases shall be made on order of the Commissioner of Purchases and Supplies by a delivery order issued against the contract or contracts and certified by the Director of Finance.

Section 7. That under Section 108(b) of the Charter, the purchases authorized by this ordinance may be made through cooperative arrangements with other governmental agencies. The Director of Port Control may sign all documents that are necessary to make the purchases, and may enter into one or more contracts with the vendors selected through that cooperative process.

The permit shall be issued only when, in the opinion of the Director of Law, the prospective Permittee has properly indemnified the City against any loss that may result from the encroachment(s) permitted.

Section 3. That Permittee may assign the permit only with the prior written consent of the Director of Capital Projects. That the encroaching structure(s) permitted under this ordinance shall conform to plans and specifications first approved by the Manager of the City's Division of Engineering and Construction. That Permittee shall obtain all other required permits, including but not limited to Building Permits, before installing the encroachment(s).

Section 4. That the permit shall reserve to the City reasonable right of entry to the encroachment location(s).

Section 5. Section 1. That Section 516.06 of the Codified Ordinances of Cleveland, Ohio 1976, as enacted by Ordinance No. 1397-14, passed October 19, 2015, is amended as follows:

Section 516.06 License Conditions
A license to paint decorative designs on certain City streets shall be subject to the following conditions:

(a) *Eligible Locations.* A design may be located at the intersection of two residential streets or a mid-block location of a residential street, and/or a crosswalk marked with two white horizontal lines, and/or a designated bicycle lane.

(b) *Paint and Design Elements.* The proposed design shall include decorative designs and patterns only, and shall contain no numerals, text, or commercial messages.

(c) *Prohibited Paint or Design Features.*

(1) The paint and resulting design shall not include any relief or texture (except anti-skid texturizing material), or retroreflectivity;

(2) The design shall not create a three (3) dimensional or multi-dimensional effect or other optical illusion; and

(3) The design shall not mimic or imitate an official traffic control device or street signage.

(d) The licensee shall notify all households and businesses within a two hundred (200) foot radius from the design location at least fourteen (14) days prior to any painting of the street.

(e) The licensee shall be responsible for all costs associated with the painting of the street including, but not limited to, costs of labor, paint, other materials, and cleanup of the street area upon completion of the painting.

(f) *Project Installation Procedure.* Once the license has been granted under this Chapter, the licensee must apply for and obtain any permits necessary for the use of the public right-of-way.

The licensee shall maintain, at no cost to the City, all aspects of the project and shall apply for and obtain any permits necessary for the use of the public right-of-way during maintenance.

(2) The licensee assumes all risk in placing the painted design on the City street including any damages, vandalism, and/or destruction of the painted design.

(g) *Indemnification.* If a license is approved, the licensee shall agree to indemnify the City of Cleveland.

(h) The City shall not be responsible for damage to the design regardless of cause, including but not limited to damage caused by any utility or contractor performing work in the right-of-way, or resulting from street surface maintenance. Additionally, if any portion of the design creates a hazard, the Director may require the removal of the painted design, and demand that the use of the City street for decorative street painting be discontinued without recourse against the City for any loss or damage occasioned by any such requirement.

(i) No license shall be transferable in any manner.

(j) Licensees and their agents shall comply with all the requirements of this Chapter.

(k) *Duration.* A license issued under this Chapter authorizes the design as approved for as long as the design exists, as long as the design does not change and it is repaired and maintained as required under the provisions of this Chapter. A request to change the originally-approved design will require an application for a new license, a new license application fee, processing as a new application, and acceptance by the City of the new donation.

(l) *License Revocation.* A license under this Chapter may be revoked by the Director at any time if the licensee violates the conditions of the approved license. Upon revocation of a license, the licensee shall, at no cost to the City, remove all aspects and/or features of a project. Prior to revocation of a license under this division, the City shall send written notice to the licensee.

Section 2. That existing Section 516.06 of the Codified Ordinances of Cleveland, Ohio 1976, as enacted by Ordinance No. 1397-14, passed October 19, 2015, is repealed.

Section 3. 5200 Superior Avenue, LLC., owner, proposes to establish use as storage area for motor vehicles pending wrecking or dismantling in a C3 Semi-Industry District. The owner appeals for relief from the strict application of the following sections of the Cleveland Codified Ordinances:

1. Section 345.03 which states that storage area for motor vehicles pending wrecking or dismantling is not permitted in Semi Industry zoning district, but is first permitted in a General Industry District per 345.04(a)(4), if the subject premises provides a minimum area of fifty thousand (50,000) square feet and is enclosed within a minimum seven (7) foot high solid masonry wall or nontransparent, well maintained substantial fence. The proposed lot is not 50,000 square feet, and a solid, 7 foot high fence or wall is not proposed.

2. Section 349.04(i) which states that open storage use requires a parking area in the amount of one space per each employee plus 15% of the total lot area; no parking area proposed.

3. Section 349.07 which states that all parking and vehicular maneuvering areas must be adequately paved, graded, and drained within lot. A gravel lot with no required parking shown is proposed. (Filed October 6, 2017)

(3) A lighting plan for the proposed tower, indicating the location, color and intensity of the lighting, both as it will appear in daylight and at night, and indicating any mechanisms to prevent glare on adjacent properties and streets and to shield the lighting from residences, to the maximum extent feasible.

(4) A vicinity map showing the subject property and the proposed tower and fencing in the context of all property located within a dis-

tance from the tower equal to three (3) times the height of the tower, showing within this area, all streets and existing buildings and significant structures and indicating the residential use of any buildings and any property zoned in Residential or Landmarks Districts, such map being marked with topographic contours at five (5) foot intervals.

(5) Color photographs showing the current view of the tower site from any adjoining public street or any other street within two hundred (200) feet of the proposed tower and from the closest groupings of residential buildings located within an area from the proposed tower equal to three (3) times the height of the proposed tower, plus a second set of color photographs showing the same views with the proposed tower superimposed onto the photographs.

(6) A map showing all existing telecommunications towers and all buildings and structures exceeding one hundred (100) feet in height located within one (1) mile of the proposed tower, with such map being accompanied by documentation, in accordance with the provisions of Section 354.05, demonstrating that the applicant has investigated all opportunities for co-location or alternative location and has determined that such co-location or alternative location is infeasible or that the owner of any such structure or attached telecommunications equipment has refused a reasonable offer for co-location.

(7) A statement indicating the estimated construction cost of the telecommunications tower and a statement indicating the estimated cost for demolition and removal of the telecommunications tower.

(8) A performance bond sufficient to cover the estimated demolition and removal of the telecommunications tower.

2. Section 354.11(b)(1) which states that at all times the permit holder shall maintain a Performance Bond sufficient to cover the demolition and removal of the telecommunications facility. Such bond shall be sufficient to guarantee full and faithful performance of the requirements of this chapter and shall be satisfactory to the Commissioner of Building and Housing and the Director of Law. On each biennial anniversary of the issuance of the Certificate of Occupancy for a telecommunications tower, or not more than ninety (90) days prior to that date, the permit holder shall provide to the Commissioner of Building and Housing proof that the performance bond requirements of this section are met.

3. Section 354.06(b) which states that no portion of a telecommunication tower shall be located closer to a residential district line than a distance equal to three times the height of the tower (tower height = 95' x 3') = 285'. The proposed tower is in split Zoning District of General Retail and Multi-Family. This section also states that the permitted "Height District" on the zoning map at the tower location is 60 feet and the proposed tower height is 98 feet. (Filed May 22, 2017 - No Testimony)
