RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE FIFTY-FIFTY SIDEWALK REPAIR PILOT PROGRAM DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SERVICE

These Rules and Regulations are issued pursuant to Section 6 of Ord. No. 725-02, passed by the Council of the City on June, 10, 2002. These

Rules and Regulations shall take effect immediately upon publication in the City Record.

1. The Program shall be available on a first-come, first-serve basis to eligible residents. To be eligible for the Program, an individual must reside in a ward for which Neighborhood Equity Funds are certified and available for this purpose. The sidewalks to be repaired must abut the individual's principal residence.

2. The sidewalks must be determined to be in an unsafe or dangerous condition in the opinion of the Director of Public Service.

3. If the resident is eligible under Paragraph 1, and if the sidewalks meet the condition under Paragraph 2, then the resident may participate in the Program by paying fifty percent of the estimated costs to be shared to the Commissioner of Assessments and Licenses and acknowledging in writing these Rules and Regulations and the estimated shared costs.

4. All work performed under the Program shall be performed by the City's Contractor, under the direction and control of the Department of Public Service. The City shall not be liable for any claims arising during performance of the work or after the work has been performed.

5. The resident must not act in a manner that will interfere with the City's contractor and must cooperate fully with any reasonable request by the City or its contractor in connection with performance of the work.

6. If the resident's portion of the shared cost exceeds the estimated payment, the Commissioner of Assessments and Licenses shall invoice the owner for the additional payment, which payment shall be due within thirty (30) days of the date of the invoice. If the resident's portion of the shared cost is less than the estimated payment, the Commissioner of Assessments and Licenses shall refund the overpayment within thirty (30) days after receipt of actual cost information from the Department of Public Service.

7. If requested by the City, the resident shall produce proof of residency, such as a voter registration card, utility bills, etc.

8. If, at any time during the one-year period following the date of completion of the work, the resident finds any defects, omissions or inadequacies for any cause which may be attributed to the City's contractor, the resident must promptly notify the Director of Public Service in writing. Upon such notification, the Director or his designee shall determine if a defect or omission or inadequacy exists, which determination shall be binding on the resident. If there is a defect, omission or inadequacy, the Director shall demand that the City's contractor correct it.

9. These Rules and Regulations may be amended upon publication of amended Rules and Regulations in the City Record.
