An emergency ordinance approving the collective bargaining agreement with International Brotherhood of Operating Engineers, Local 10.

Whereas, this ordinance constitutes an emergency measure providing for the usual daily operation of a municipal department; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the Council of the City of Cleveland:

Section 1. That, in accordance with division (B) of Section 4117.10 of the Revised Code, this Council hereby approves the collective bargaining agreement with the International Brotherhood of Operating Engineers, Local 10, for the period from April 1, 2001 through March 31, 2004, which provides, among other things, for an increase in the salaries and wages for members of the bargaining unit in accordance with the following schedule:

Increase	Effective Date of Increase
Three percent (3%)	April 1, 2001
Three and one-half percent (3.5%)	April 1, 2002
Four percent (4%)	April 1, 2003

Section 2. That this ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure and, provided it receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor; otherwise it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
