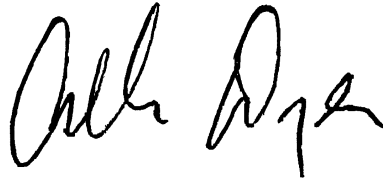

Resolved, by the Board of Control of the City of Cleveland that the bid of Graham Enterprises, Inc., d.b.a. Aries Distribution, for an estimated quantity of industrial paper and cloth wipers, for all items, for the various divisions of City government, for the period of one year beginning with the date of execution of a contract, received on November 21, 2008, under the authority of Section 181.101 of the Codified Ordinances of Cleveland, Ohio, 1976, which on the basis of the estimated quantity would amount to \$245,058.50, is affirmed and approved as the lowest and best bid, and the Director of Finance is requested to enter into a requirement contract for the goods and/or services, which shall provide for the immediate purchase as the initial amount of the contract of the following:
