The following measure will be on its final passage on March 27, 2017:

Ord. No. 130-17.

By Council Member Kelley (by departmental request).

An emergency ordinance to make appropriations and provide current expenses for the daily operation of all municipal departments of the City of Cleveland for the fiscal year from January 1, 2017 until December 31, 2017.

Whereas, this ordinance constitutes an emergency measure providing for the daily operation of a municipal department; now therefore,

Be it ordained by the Council of the City of Cleveland:

Section 1. That to provide for the current expenses for the City of Cleveland for the fiscal year ending December 31, 2017, the following sums be and they are hereby appropriated via:

The sum of Six Hundred Seven Million, Three Hundred Seventeen Thousand, Three Hundred Sixteen Dollars (\$607,317,316) from the General Fund;

The sum of Eighty Nine Million, Nine Hundred Eighty Two Thousand, Seven Hundred Seventy Nine Dollars (\$89,982,779) from the Special Revenue Funds;

The sum of Sixty Five Million, Two Hundred Sixty Six Thousand, Six Hundred Forty Eight Dollars (\$65,266,648) from the Debt Service Fund;

The sum of One Hundred Thirty Five Million, Five Hundred Ninety Thousand, Eighty Five Dollars (\$135,590,085) from the Internal Service Funds;

The sum of Seven Hundred Eighty Three Million, Seventy Six Thousand, Eight Hundred Five Dollars (\$783,076,805) from the Enterprise Fund;

The sum of Eleven Million, Seven Hundred Eighty Two Thousand, Nine Hundred Fifty Four Dollars (\$11,782,954) from the Trust and Agency Funds;

Section 2. That the appropriations herein made are based upon the detail of expenditures set forth in the Mayor's Estimate, but are appropriated in the several departments, offices, and purposes in the aggregate for I. - Personnel and Related Expenses; and II. - Other Expenses and are not severally and individually appropriated in said detail. Performs other job-related duties as required.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS

DRIVER'S LICENSE

WORK HOURS

Firefighters **must** be available to work any shift on any day of the week.

AMERICANS WITH DISABILITIES ACT

Any individual with a disability who requires reasonable accommodation in order to compete effectively on this examination shall notify the Civil Service Commission of such need on the appropriate form, available through Civil Service, **at the time of filing.** The Commission will contact the individual concerning such accommodation prior to the examination. EXAMINATION INFORMATION

Physical Abilities Examination

Physical abilities testing will occur after the eligible list is established from the electronic testing process. This test is pass/fail and designed to evaluate physical ability to perform the duties of a Firefighter. Applicants invited to complete the physical capability test will be notified of their scheduled date, time, and location to take the test via email when being considered for an academy class. The physical skills test contains events which reflect physical activities actually encountered on the job by Cleveland Firefighters. Additional information regarding the test requirement will be provided to candidates after they have applied for the examination.

ADDITIONAL SELECTION PROCEDURES

Applicants who receive a passing grade on the written examination score, pass the physical abilities examination, rank high enough on the eligible list for Firefighter, and receive Civil Service Certification will be subject to the following examinations:

Drug Screening: Each applicant shall undergo an examination for drug usage. This examination may be in the form of urinalysis. Any applicant whose results from the drug screening examination are determined to be positive shall be removed from the eligibility list unless such results can be satisfactorily related to the advice of a recognized medical practitioner. Drug screening may also be conducted after appointment to the academy.

Background Investigation: Background investigation and evaluation may include interviews with present and previous employers. Neighbors and family may be contacted as part of the investigation. In addition, a check of Local and State Police and FBI records, both adult and juvenile, and Bureau of Motor Vehicle records will be made. The background test also includes review of sealed and expunged records and military service if applicable. Unsatisfactory findings in one or more of these areas

may be cause for removal from the Civil Service eligibility list. **Conviction of a felony is absolute grounds for removal from the list. Any applicant convicted of a felony will be removed from the eligible list and will receive no further consideration. There are also misdemeanor convictions that would result in the removal of an applicant from the eligibility list.**

Psychological Evaluation: A psychological evaluation to determine the applicant's emotional suitability to perform all aspects of the job will be conducted. Each applicant may be required to take several written examinations. These, along with the results of the background investigation, will be submitted to one or more psychologist(s)/psychiatrist(s) who will interview the candidates. All records of the psychological and background examinations will be made available to the Civil Service Commission. The Commission will review such records and make the final determination of each applicant's suitability for removal from the eligible list.

Medical Examination: Any appointment to the position of Firefighter will be conditioned upon passing a pre-employment medical examination conducted in accordance with the provisions of Title I of the Federal American's with Disabilities Act (ADA). A copy of the ADA may be obtained online at www.ada.gov/pubs/adasatute08.htm. The standards for the medical examination are available for review in the Office of the Civil Service Commission.

LIFE OF THE ELIGIBILITY LIST

**** "CURRENT" SHALL BE WITH IN THE LAST THREE MONTHS.** For example, if you are filing for the examination in October of 2016 you must present 4 different documents dated **July, or August, or September of 2016.**

ADOPTED RESOLUTIONS AND ORDINANCES

Res. No. 218-17. By Council Member Kelley. An emergency resolution strongly opposing Governor Kasich's proposed 2017-2018 Budget, which establishes a state centralized filing and collection of municipal income taxes, includes other provisions adverse to municipalities related to municipal income tax, and modifies the distribution formula of the Local Government Fund, all of which will cause a substantial loss of revenue needed to support the health, safety, welfare and economic development efforts of the City of Cleveland and all other Ohio municipalities.

Whereas, with his proposed Budget bill, Ohio Governor Kasich and his administration will establish a state-operated program for the centralized filing and collection of Ohio Municipal Income Tax; and

Whereas, the proposed establishment of centralized collection by the State effectively usurps from local governments the authority to impose and collect Municipal Income Tax on Corporate Net Profits and will allow and facilitate any State policy to reduce or phase out this tax revenue at the local level, as the State did with the Estate Tax, Commercial Activity Tax and Personal Property Tax; and

Whereas, the proposed establishment of centralized collection by the State will increase the City of Cleveland's financial burdens by further reducing revenue and by effectively severing Cleveland's financial lifeblood; in 2016 Cleveland collected \$44.4 million in Net Profit tax; the State proposes to distribute the tax receipts to municipalities on a quarterly basis, net a 1% collection fee; and

Whereas, quarterly distribution of tax receipts would disrupt the City's consistent cash flow and seriously damage the City's financial stability; and

Whereas, this proposal eliminates a municipality's ability to audit and verify the accuracy of the tax payments received; and

Whereas, the proposed language also would eliminate the "throwback" rule, substantially reducing reportable tax revenue to municipalities with warehouses, distribution centers, and any business providing online sales; and

Whereas, for years, the City's Central Collection Agency, which collects Cleveland's local income tax, as well as the income taxes of 50 other Ohio communities, has provided personal service and assistance to taxpayers in preparation and filing of tax reports and returns; and

Whereas, only municipalities can ensure prompt and proper auditing of local tax returns to guarantee all applicable deductions and declarations are reported, thus making sure all taxpayers pay their fair share without causing higher costs of compliance for everyone; and

Whereas, although the State has said its proposal would eliminate the supposed confusion over the different municipal tax laws under which businesses located in more than one municipality must file, Cleveland's Central Collection Agency has never received complaints from businesses regarding confusion or frustration over cities' allegedly different tax codes; and

Whereas, this Council believes that the Governor's budget proposal was created for the sole purpose of restricting a municipality's ability to correct and audit business return filings and to equitably enforce municipal income tax laws; it will be used by the state to control the administrative process of municipal income tax collections to the benefit of specific taxpayer interests; and

Whereas, the municipal income tax is the City of Cleveland's single largest revenue source that provides essential city services and, in turn, provides a stable quality of life that residents and businesses alike rely upon; any forced reduction in this revenue will have a negative impact on residents and businesses, creating an environment detrimental to retaining and attracting business in Ohio; and

Whereas, because the City of Cleveland cannot afford more reduced revenues due to State cuts, this Council also opposes the State's proposed new distribution formula of the Local Government Fund (LGF) which will reduce funding to municipalities deemed to have the "ability to raise revenue" thus punishing municipalities that may have increased income taxes in order to generate revenues lost from the reductions in the LGF, the elimination of Estate Tax, and the repeal of the Tangible Personal Property Tax; and

Whereas, by way of example, regarding reductions in the LGF: in 2016 Cleveland collected \$24.6 million from the LGF; in 2011 the amount collected through the LGF was \$51.4 million; the City's accumulated loss of revenue from changes in the LGF since 2010 is \$174.1 million dollars; and

Whereas, the proposal for a state takeover of collection of municipal income taxes of municipal corporations such as the City of Cleveland

is a clear attack on the home rule powers granted to municipal corporations by the Ohio Constitution; and

Whereas, the this Council categorically objects to this latest attack on municipal home rule under consideration by the State of Ohio and urges all municipal corporations to make it clear to the Governor and General Assembly that this proposed usurpation of constitutionally-granted local municipal power shall not take place without a vigorous legal challenge by affected municipal corporations; and

Whereas, the General Assembly should: request immediate removal from the 2017-2018 Budget bill of all language pertaining to municipal income tax collection and administration; promote upcoming changes to the Ohio Business Gateway as a solution for businesses to file municipal income tax returns in a more simple and efficient manner, with the Ohio Business Gateway continuing to act only as a portal to remit payments; and endorse filing tax returns directly to municipalities and not the Ohio Department of Taxation; and

Whereas, this resolution constitutes an emergency measure for the immediate preservation of public peace, property, health or safety, now, therefore,

Be it resolved by the Council of the City of Cleveland:

Section 1. That this Council strongly opposes Governor Kasich's proposed 2017-2018 Budget, which establishes a state centralized filing and collection of municipal income taxes, includes other provisions adverse to municipalities related to municipal income tax, and modifies the distribution formula of the Local Government Fund, all of which will cause a substantial loss of revenue needed to support the health, safety, welfare and economic development efforts of the City of Cleveland and all other Ohio municipalities.

That the Director of Port Control is authorized to enter into an amendment to the existing Lease Agreement with I-X Center Corporation (the "Lease"), as authorized by Ordinance No. 68-94, passed January 18, 1994 as amended by Ordinance No. 77-99, passed January 14, 1999 and Ordinance No. 1327-08, passed November 10, 2008, to extend the term of the Lease, as amended, for seven months until August 31, 2019.
