Near West Recreation Basketball Court Unveiling

Gatorade Expands Its Commitment to Equity in Sports by Encouraging Young Girls to Stay in the Game

From Laureus USA

Research has shown that girls are dropping out of sports at twice the rate of boys*.

Gatorade, a brand that has championed women in sports with its longstanding history, is working to combat this issue by expanding access and breaking down barriers to inspire the next generation of female athletes to get in the game. Through the Gatorade Equity in Sports initiative, the brand is committed to making an impact in local communities by helping reduce the barriers to play.

As a part of this initiative, Gatorade has partnered with Laureus USA and Good Sports to support young girls in sports and physical activity. In April, Gatorade surprised Near West Recreation, a Cleveland, OH-based organization serving more than 1,000 young people annually, by unveiling the newly refurbished Lakeview Terrace Community Center basketball court with a celebratory event. Young girls from Near West Recreation's programs were taken through a series of passing and shooting drills aimed at improving their skills on the court - and received an additional treat: a surprise video from WNBA superstar A'ja Wilson on the benefit of sports and encouraging young athletes to stay in the game.

As a part of Gatorade's Equity in Sports partnership with Laureus USA and Good Sports, Near West Recreation will be receiving new sports equipment worth \$50,000 in retail value, which will encourage girls to get into and remain in the game. Gatorade also supplied all athletes with a kit that included the new limited-edition Caitlin Clark bottle drop.

Laureus USA is a nonprofit, grantmaking organization committed to



improving the lives of youth and uniting communities through the power of sport. Globally, Laureus Sport for Good champions sports programs that enhance the social and emotional development of children and young people. Through grantmaking, advocacy, research, and backbone capacity-building support, Laureus supports 300 programs across 50 countries. Over the last two decades, they have helped to change the lives of almost 6 million children and young athletes.

Good Sports is a national nonprofit that aims to drive equitable access in youth sports and physical activity by supporting children in high-need communities to achieve their greatest potential, on the field and in life. Since 2021, Good Sports has been an official Equity in Sports partner of Gatorade, providing more than \$1,150,000 retail value of new sporting equipment to sports organizations throughout the country to support thousands of youth athletes who may not have the same means or opportunity to play.

This initiative by Gatorade highlights the brand's commitment to drive equity in sports and ensure that every athlete has access to the tools and opportunities they need to succeed.

Cleveland Public Market Corporation Assumes Management of West Side Market, Names Staff

On Wednesday, April 24, the Cleveland Public Market Corporation (CPMC) took over day-to-day operational management of West Side Market from the City of Cleveland. Per the terms of a management agreement signed between the City and CPMC, the City maintains ownership of the Market's land and facilities, while CPMC can independently operate the Market to plan for new programs and improvements, efficiently respond to merchant needs, and oversee the execution of the Market's masterplan.

"For years I, and other community stakeholders, have been advocating for a new management model at the West Side Market; a model that honors the history of this Cleveland icon, the wellbeing of its current vendors, and the future vision of a vibrant marketplace," said Ward 3 Councilman and CPMC Board Member Kerry McCormack. "I am thankful that Mayor Bibb listened to the community and acted quickly on these critical reforms."

CPMC is led by an independent board of directors and Executive Director Rosemary Mudry, a veteran of Cleveland community development organizations who began her career at Ohio City, Inc. Mudry's first charge prior to CPMC taking on management of the Market was to hire the organization's full-time staff. The inaugural CPMC staff are:

 Andjeski comes to CPMC having spent the last 12 years managing operations and finance systems as controller and "office boss" at Spice Hospitality Group.
- Camille Rose Dickson, Director of Development and Partnerships: Dickson brings nearly a decade of non-profit experience to CPMC. She most recently served as development and communications manager at the Legal Aid Society of Cleveland.
- Patrick Evans, Director of Marketing: Evans has more than 16 years' experience in marketing and advertising in Cleveland. He has led the marketing efforts at multiple local non-profit visitor destinations, including previously serving as director of marketing at Cleveland Museum of Natural History.
- Demarco Jones, Assistant Director of Operations: Jones is a seasoned property management professional with experience in commercial and residential spaces.
- Gabe Fedor, Merchant and Leasing Coordinator:
 Fedor has more than 5 years' experience in property management and commercial tenant leasing.



Ohio City Clean and Safe Ambassadors

Ohio City Improvement Corporation has made a big switch to changing service providers at Block by Block. While we will be keeping all the familiar faces you have grown to know and love over the years. Our service phone number has changed to contact Clean and Safe Ambassadors for things such as the following:

- Hospitality Assists: escorts (to your car or a bus stop; umbrella escorts, etc.), restaurant recommendations, providing directions.
- Business contacts
- · Security checks
- Vehicle Assists (car lockouts, car jumps, flat tire fixes)

Clean and Safe Ambassadors patrol the district, acting as the eyes and ears for police. On duty until midnight at the latest, Ambassadors follow a preset schedule and make regular stops by businesses on their route to gather and share security-related information and concerns. Lakeview Connects

Lakeview Connects is a planning process to build a cohesive vision for the future infrastructure of the area in and near Lakeview Estates, including the Flats West Bank and the larger Ohio City neighborhood.

Currently, the City of Cleveland is evaluating options for the future of the Willow Avenue Lift Bridge, which connects pedestrians and cyclists to Whiskey Island, as well as trucks to nearby industries. Additionally, Cuyahoga Metropolitan Housing Authority (CMHA) is working on a new master plan for the future Lakeview Estates. The Lakeview Connects plan looks to build off this momentum for the area and address infrastructure and quality of life issues that have plagued both the local residents and the industrial users.

Goals of Lakeview Connects

- Build off the Vision For the Valley Vision Plan
- Leverage the work of the underway Lakeview Estates Master Plan
- Facilitate stakeholder-driven input of the Willow Avenue Lift Bridge replacement project
- Prepare a connectivity strategy including potential infrastructure and transportation system improvements that connects to current and future assets
- Look at potential long-term infill development strategies and development concepts
- Address air quality injustice that has long plagued the neighborhood & find ways to creatively mitigate truck traffic impact

I am honored to welcome Myanmar national Zin Min Thu to Cleveland as part of the American Council of Young

Political Leaders (ACYPL) exchange program! I am a proud AYCPL alumnus, having visited the nation of Indonesia in February 2023. I am hosting Zin to fulfill my commitment to



the organization – and to share Cleveland's rich cultural, political, and economic attributes with the world.

ACYPL's mission is to give "emerging leaders the opportunity to travel internationally and make new connections with their peers across the aisle and around the world." The organization operates exchange programs that give tomorrow's leaders a global perspective, from delegations of Americans traveling abroad to groups of international leaders traveling to the U.S.

Myanmar is located in southeast Asia. Throughout its history, the nation has experienced several military takeovers, the most recent in February 2021. Zin currently works for Myanmar's "government in exile," a collection of professionals working to support and restore the government, which was overturned in February 2021. She is dedicated to restoring and preserving democracy within Myanmar's borders.

For her safety, Zin works for the Myanmar government in exile and lives in Thailand, a nation that borders Myanmar. During her stay in Cleveland, Zin hopes to learn more about governmental communication with and to residents. This includes how governments hear and use feedback from the public and how the government communicates openly and honestly with residents, organizations, and constituents.

Besides shadowing me, Zin has attended a Cleveland Guardians game, experienced the Cleveland Orchestra, and participated in team-build activities with other AYCPL fellows visiting Cleveland and northeast Ohio.

Zin hopes to apply what she learned in Cleveland to restore democracy in Myanmar and improve living conditions for the nation's 55 million residents.

Please join me in welcoming Zin to Cleveland and wishing her success in bringing positive change to Myanmar!
