A MESSAGE FROM Councilman Kevin L. Bishop

Dear Residents!

With the snow and bitter cold almost in the rear view window, I want to talk to you about traffic calming efforts in the Ward.

Too many residents and visitors speed through our main thoroughfares, specifically E. 93rd Street and Miles Avenue. I'm working with the city to implement measures to slow drivers down on these two important and busy streets. Stay tuned.

In other news, I know it's taken a long time but the veterans' housing project will soon be breaking ground in our neighborhood. The Walter Collins Veteran Housing & Services Facility will be built on vacant land on Harvard Avenue, east of E. 93rd Street.

Finally, with better weather, you can enjoy the renovated Glendale Park and its new basketball court, exercise equipment, game tables, multi-use field, playground, and splash pad, which were all finished last fall. (Of course, Dove Park, a year earlier, got a

new play area, new swings, a rubberized soft surface, benches, game tables, and fencing.)

Spring brings out the animals. Remember to call Animal Control Officers who will pick up stray dogs, stray injured cats, and trapped nuisance wildlife (skunks, groundhogs, opossums, and raccoons). Call the Division of Animal Control at 216-664-3069. If vacant properties attract wildlife, please call Building & Housing at 216-664-2007.



Chore Program



Qualifications

- All members of the household must be over 60 or functionally disabled.
- The house may be a single or two family dwelling. Multi-family homes do not qualify.
- Home must be owner occupied and located within the City of Cleveland. * Non homeowners and apartment residents may receive indoor chore services.

Client Responsibilities

- Secure pets away from the service area.
- Yard must be free of animal waste.
- Notify the office when the service is not needed.

Grass Cutting Program Description

- Service will begin in May and will continue through the end of October.
- Service will be provided approximately one time per month.
- A combination of full-time and parttime Chore staff members and Court Community Service workers will provide the service.
- Every attempt will be made to service clients with citations within the grace period of the citation if the Chore Program office is notified.
- There is no charge for this service.

Leaf Raking

Leaves are raked one time in the fall, weather permitting.

Snow Shoveling

- Steps and pathways are shoveled to allow safe entrance and exit from the home.
- The service does not include plowing driveways.
- The service begins with the first snow and continues through March of the following year.
- Priority is given to seniors with medical appointments and home care providers.

Indoor Chores

- During winter months, Chore staff members are available to do limited indoor chores for Cleveland seniors and adults with disabilities.
- Examples of the types of tasks include the installation of smoke detectors and general house cleaning.
- You must call each time to request an indoor chore appointment.

Unsolicited Real Estate Offers

The Ward 2 office has started receiving requests from residents seeking advice on how to handle persistent and unsolicited offers for their homes. These communications come in various forms, including mail, phone calls, text messages, and emails. In February, the Ohio Department of Commerce, Division of Real Estate and Professional Licensing (REPL) issued a statement urging Ohioans to be cautious when approached with unexpected offers to buy their property:

Beware of Unsolicited Real Estate

- · Many Ohio residents have reported receiving these unsolicited offers, sometimes with specific dollar amounts.
- Homeowners might unknowingly sell their property for much less than its actual value or agree to lease terms with serious financial consequences.

Why These Offers Are Increasing & What to Watch For

- A national housing shortage and low vacancy rates in Ohio have led to more unsolicited offers.
- · Some offers include an official REPL disclosure form, which may mislead homeowners into thinking the offer is backed by the state.
- REPL clarifies that the presence of this form does not confirm the legitimacy of the offer.
- To protect themselves, homeowners
 - ✓ Research offers carefully.
 - √ Ask if the buyer is a licensed Ohio real estate agent.



✓ Consult a real estate professional or attorney before signing anything.

How to Stay Safe & Where to Get Help

- REPL Superintendent Daphne Hawk advises homeowners to take their time and avoid rushed decisions.
- · If an offer seems too good to be true, it might actually be well below market value.
- Homeowners can use Federal Trade Commission (FTC) resources to: ✓ Reduce junk mail.
 - ✓ Block spam calls.
 - ✓ If you suspect a real estate scam, contact your local law enforcement agency.
