Councilman Kelly Fights for Fair Wages

It is no wonder Councilman Danny Kelly, an active, duespaying member of Laborers' Local 310 for nearly five decades, has become a go-to council member in the fight for workers' rights. He is the first member of Cleveland City Council who carries a construction laborer's union book in his back pocket.

Kelly's perspective has been eye opening to council as a whole. This first became evident when he learned that not all contract workers providing services to the City of Cleveland were making a Living Wage. He lead the charge to change that when he and other members sponsored legislation to set the required minimum wage at \$15.33 an hour for contract workers and to tie future increases to inflation rates.

Clearly, his colleagues took notice. When it was time to resuscitate the Cleveland Fair Employment Wage Board with new blood, Cleveland City Council appointed Councilman Kelly to fill its one designated board seat. "It is a privilege to serve on this board. I am right at home tackling wage issues for workers," said Kelly.

The mayor appointed six board members and Cleveland City Council appointed one. Council approved the board members. The board began meeting this summer. Its duties include ensuring that employers with city contracts pay Cleveland's Fair Employment wage and overseeing Cleveland's wage theft law. The board plans to meet quarterly. Stay tuned for progress updates!

This is the second organization council tapped Kelly to serve on. Due to his extensive work to keep Clevelanders safe and his service on the Safety Committee, he also serves on the Cleveland Neighborhood Safety Fund's Advisory Committee alongside his colleagues, Ward 7 Councilwoman Stephanie Howse-Jones and Ward 5 Councilman Richard Starr.


